I have had several health problems but still try to keep active We have been here in Massapequa 50 years now and I just was given a party for being a member of the Massapequa Fire Dept for 50 years and add this to my 23 years in the Lynbrook F D for 73 years total Last year I stoped riding to fires and rescue calls at age 87with a total well over 15,000 during these years and there were many large fires in Lynbrook while I was in the chiefs office from 1961 threw 1965 that possibly some of the class member will remember in those years in addition to the Rockville Centre train wreck I started working for Mack truck in 1946 when I go out of school in Long Island City N Y where they were manufacturing there fire engines which was very good as many of my class mates will remember I was a fire engine nut being at the engine company fire house next to the high school at age 11 where I became a buff and then a junior fire man at age 16 (1943) during the war and started riding to fire and rescue calls on the Mack truck that was the medical transport with a canvass back and half doors on the cab Boy it was cold in the winter being in the back with the patient many calls During this time I quite possibly responded to your home for a fire or medical call Mack started me selling there fire engines in 1949 on my 21 st birthday My family asked that I stop selling last year during those years I sold apparatus to Long Island and Westchester counties delivering between 700 - 800 pieces of apparatus Thank you for your interest if you read this entry Kind regards to all with best wishes for a healthy and happy new year Karl Thuge E Mail Cougar2u@aol.com 516 972 7921

This artist truly had an interesting imagination and she had on display paintings, photos and videos to exhibit her "work" in "Food Porn." Use your imagination.

After wandering through another 5th floor exhibit of "Iggy Pop Life Classic" we headed for the elevator to the 4th floor. Oh, Iggy Pop you wonder? It seems Iggy Pop wanted to know what he looked like naked therefore he posed naked for twelve selected artists who drew sketches of Iggy Pop in his "Au natural". No further comment. We managed to quickly walk out of that exhibit just as a high school class of young girls, led by their art teacher, entered for the viewing. Did we miss something while attending Lynbrook High School?

Yes, there were other exhibits showing ancient "Egypt Afterlife" and "Arts of Asia and the Islamic World" on the top floor (5th) but we took the elevator down to the exhibit we really went to see on the 4th floor, "Who Shot Sports: A Photographic History". On display were over 100 B&W and color photos taken by a variety of sports photographers for Life magazine, Sports Illustrated, various newspapers and some independent photographers showing everything from Clay standing over Liston, Jeter sliding head first into 3rd base, brutal boxing knock-outs, Jackie stealing home in the 1955 World Series, NFL concussions in the making, divers jumping from over 400 feet off some cliff, race car crashes and of course the Babe at his Yankee Stadium Farewell Day.

It was a good exhibit and it made the trip worthwhile.

Those who are still wondering, the "Food Porn" and the "Pretty/Dirty" exhibit was "work" done by Marilyn Minter and ends April 2, 2017. If you are interested in viewing to see what she had on her dinner plate the admission is only \$6 for seniors. Iggy Pop ends March 26, 2017 but the Sports Photos display has ended.

With last year's bond issue being voted down by the residents which would have cost each homeowner a minimum of \$350 per household per year the BOE has presented a Revised Bond Proposal to be voted upon this year if the BOE decides to go forward.

To give you an idea as to what would take place imagine looking at the front of the building as we knew it when we attended LHS. The left side will have an additional "wing" of two floors. The first floor will have two large band rehearsal-practice areas with storage rooms while the second floor will have 3-4 science rooms for research and regular science classes. The present science rooms will be converted to larger art rooms. The auditorium, as we knew it without a balcony, will be renovated with a better sound system and better seating. The stage will remain as when we were attending LHS. There will be a new nurse's office in the front near the main entrance and an additional athletic storage room will be added to the rear of the building.

The wrestling room, which is now in the basement of the Atlantic Avenue School, will be renovated to a larger practice area with improved lockers. Both North and South Middle Schools will have renovated locker rooms and the gymnasiums in all of the Elementary Schools will have air conditioning.

With the "average" home in Lynbrook accessed (by Nassau County) at \$333,600 the home owner will see an increase in School taxes by a minimum of \$168 a year. If your home is accessed higher then the cost will be higher, and lower if accessed lower than the \$333,600. The overall projected costs will be a \$33,925,603. To help reduce that overall cost, \$5 million will be taken from the reserve fund to bring the bond proposal to \$28,925,603. Some State aid is also expected to further lower the total cost for the tax payers.

More discussion will take place at the February BOE meeting.
