Fascinating. Yes, fascinating that's the right word for our monthly museum trip which was taken by Bob Golf (1958), Lew McCurdy (1959) and Don Roth (1958) as we met at the Queens Museum on Wednesday, December 21st.

The exhibition this month at this museum featured MAINTENANCE ART by artist Mierle Laderman Ukeles. She did a fascinating display of artwork dealing with the NYC garbage. Yes, garbage! Again, fascinating is the right word. One display had her changing the Fresh Kills "dump" on Staten Island into a beautiful park/garden where tourists are now visiting. The photos taken and displayed on the museum walls were unbelievable. The three of us are already making plans to visit the Fresh Kills next summer.

The cost for this museum is a "donation" of any amount.

In another section of this large museum building is a panorama model of the NYC boroughs. This model shows 895,000 buildings, every street and park over 100 bridges and consists of a total of 320 square miles of New York City. Each building is built to scale with the Empire State building being 15 inches tall. Parts of Long Island and New Jersey are also included. There are moving airplanes taking off and landing at LGA and JFK. I could go on about this model but words cannot describe it's overwhelming appearance. You've got to see it yourself. It was built for the 1964 World's Fair as the "City of the Future". Oh by the way, it took 100 workers THREE years to complete this model display. If you live in the New York area I strongly suggest you visit this museum before the Maintenance Art (Sanitation Art) gets moved. The viewing ends February 19, 2017.

After the viewing there is a gift shop and cafe on the lower level. Fascinating, yes that's the correct word. The Museum is located just off the Grand Central Parkway next to the Arthur Ashe tennis center. Parking is free next to the building.

Hi Jim, again I want to thank you for all the efforts you put into writing and sending the WOO Some nostalgia: Do you all remember Mur-Lees Men Shop? It was under the RR trestle on Atlantic Ave, probably from the 40's. Bart loved their clothes and their personal attention. Even when we moved to California we would shop at Mur-lees whenever we were home for a visit. Murray and Lee died some time ago and the boys, Bruce and Harry, took over the shop, and moved further north on Atlantic, approximately across from where Woolworths had been. Bart has been retired for 20 years and we live on the North Shore in Port Jefferson so we have not been in there in years. But he drove in the other day and he was met with a rousing welcome. And all is still the same.

On another note, Newsday sent out a copy of their first edition (11/21/1940 - cost 3 cents) to mark their 76th anniversary. Some of the stories were "Aircraft factory Watches for Sabatoge" (Republic in Farmingdale). Also, area banks reported a boom in Christmas Club payouts. Personal loans at 5% to "buy that new 1941 model". (Don't forget that the US stopped auto production right after this till 1945 to make jeeps for the war.

Ads included professional photos at \$1.00, Corset Services, Men's 2 trouser suits at \$25.00, White Horse Scotch \$2.65. There was also an editorial about the division in the country about whether to change Thanksgiving to the fourth rather than the fifth Thursday as Pres Roosevelt proposed. In The Your Baby and Mine column, the subject was " Constipation is not Heredity". Some of the classified ads were: 1939 Packard , with radio and heater for \$725, apartment for rent "four rooms and bath, 89 Smith Street , phone Lynbrook 4548\_W. , in Freeport a six-room house was \$45 a month
