Wishing all you other survivors a good 2018...we sure haven't had a boring 2017, but maybe we can get through the next one with a little less drama...and New Years Eve with a bit less snow!

I am enjoying having half a weekend for two weeks! I usually work Saturday-Sunday-Monday at the museum Oklahoma State Museum of Natural History) so can't see friends who get weekends off, or wind up getting together in

the evening down in town in my uniform! We get both Sunday and Monday off this year, for both major holidays, so I get a chance to attend evening events dressed like the rest of the world!

Love my work and all those little 5-8 year old kids who love and know about dinosaurs. Most of ours are real or have only a few "bones" (dinosaur bones are actually stone, for the most part, as water brings mineral matter into them and

replaces the bone, leaving a perfect stone reproduction of the original) that are made from molds of bones from similar species. I keep some fossils (from a dig last year and one in California 26 years ago) in a little container in my

pocket and give one to kids who are knowledgeable and enthused on Paleontology. The ones I found here are 470 million years old from the Ordovician Sea that once covered the world, and the ones from Lake Forest, CA (about a mile

from our home there) are about 400 million years old and are mostly teeth from the Devonian Sea. Local ones are brachiopods and a few trilobites. Kept the best ones from the collections and they show up in the jewelry I make with

Polymer clay. Easy to make pretty patterns with ancient shark teeth...in swirls against a pale blue sea with a bit of sand from Laguna Beach, Ca at the bottom! That one got made in a fit of homesickness....I miss California every day of my life!

Do any of you remember my kid sister, Barbie Hill? We had a lovely Christmas together at her horse/sheep ranch about a mile from my underground house (where else would a California girl live in the land of tornadoes?), and had lots of entertainment watching two of her dogs playing tug of war with the toys Santa left for them. Her West White Terrier and Border Collie were well matched for energy and spunk, if not for size! My Cairn had to stay home this year because he has gone deaf and blind in old age, and his cousins would be too rough for him now.

Hope you all fared well this year, and next year sees us all still enjoying Woo! Happy New Year, Nance (Hill) Ross, Norman Oklahoma
