WHAT YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT LYNBROOK ALUMNI

GEORGE BALDWIN: **was in the Lynbrook graduating class of 1943. After graduating George joined the US Marine Corps. He was assigned to**

Rear Admiral Richard Byrd's exploration of Antarctica as an areal photographer. Because of Sgt Baldwin's excellent work as the official photographer,

Rear Admiral Byrd named one of the Antarctica's glaciers the "Baldwin Glacier." To honor his high school, Sgt Baldwin named one of the peaks on this glacier, peak LHS.

PAUL RUESTOW: **was in the graduating class of 1926 of Lynbrook High School. Paul was the first Lynbrook graduate to be admitted to the**

US Military Academy_

at West Point. During his military career as an engineer, Paul rose to the rank of Brigadier General and was a member of the staff of General Dwight Eisenhower's

WWII Command and later was transferred to the Pacific Command under General Douglas McArthur.

MITCH LEBE: Graduated from Lynbrook High School in 1959 and went on to become a noted radio broadcaster for NY stations. He started as a "teenage Phenom"

on the Allan Fried Rock and Roll show and moved along to where he is now a news broadcaster on AM stations.

MARYANN ROQU Graduated from Lynbrook in 1970. She began as a night time disc jockey on 106.1 FM playing soft music. She moved along during her:

career to her present position as news caster on WOR-AM. She now goes by the name of JJ Kennedy.

CHARLES HOWARD MEIER CHARLES HOWARD MEIER: Howard graduated with the Class of 1951 and after earning a degree from Cornell entered the US Air

Force Academy graduating with that school's first graduating class. Howard was the first Lynbrook High School student to attend and graduate from the
