Times have changed!

The Lynbrook School District, as well as every other district in New York State, has set aside monies to improve security for each of the district's school

buildings. The amount allocated by Lynbrook is \$838,978.

The latest report indicates that each Elementary school will have a door lock system to prevent anybody from entering unless "buzzed" in by the "guard"

on duty at the front door desk. These Elementary "guards" are usually local retired men and women being paid a minimal salary to sit at the front door

from 7 AM until school is dismissed.

The high school will have a more elaborate system. The front door of the high school will have a new foyer added that will require all students to pass

through showing their school photo pass to the "guard" on duty at the front door desk. This "guard" will also be behind a glass enclosure but able to

view the front door and those entering. With the high school being an "open door" policy at lunchtimes it can be difficult to watch everyone coming and going.

There are also three hired security guards who carry no weapons other than "walkie talkies". One security guard stands at the front of the building

while the other two rotate around the building all day long. They do exchange posts every few hours. If a parent arrives at the high school to leave

anything for a student/child that item will be placed in a box in the "new foyer" and scanned before it is delivered. All other doors that can be used

for entering/exiting will be locked with a teacher on duty in that area to make sure no student opens a door to let anyone in whether it be another

student or any employee. Students still tend to jam a side or rear door so they can exit and enter with their lunch rather than walk to the front door

to enter. What is interesting is there hasn't been any planning as to how to handle a basketball/wrestling/volleyball/classnite/concert/etc crowd when

they enter or exit.

Yes times are changing. The new building addition that was voted on and passed two years ago has still not broken ground as the District has to wait

for the State to approve the building plans and construction. The State hasn't moved too fast on this project.

The Malverne school district is in the process of building a new 350 seat auditorium along with science and music classrooms adjacent to the existing

building. That work has begun and it looks like it may be completed by next summer. It is one huge project.

I will keep you posted if anything new develops with the Lynbrook school district or the Village in general.

There is still no marquee on the new Regal movie theater. I have no idea what is showing at the Regal theater. The Regal is not listed in the movie

guide in Newsday. There are movie posters on the theater wall but who can read them driving by at 25 MPH or from a distance of 50 yards? Malverne

movie theater here I come again and I will still pay the \$6 senior rates for a good movie! I was told the Regal charges seniors \$12-\$16 for a ticket

depending on the show time. Bring back the Arcade!

on courses offered, staff, athletics, safety, cafeteria and percentages of students passing certain State tests. Here's the ranking as of August 1, 2018.

Those districts in Nassau County and in their State rankings are:

Jericho #1 (in the State!), Syosset #5, Roslyn #6, Herricks #7, Manhasset #11, Bellmore #19, Plainview #22, Hewlett #24, Locust Valley #30,

Bethpage #32, North Shore #34, Great Neck Schools #48, Valley Stream Central #49 and LYNBROOK #51.

There are a total of 675 school districts in the State therefore LYNBROOK is 51/675.

Lynbrook ranked A+ through A in most categories but drew a B- in cafeteria food. Athletics was an A-. Lynbrook has in the

District, K through 12, 2773 students and is ranked 76/675 as the safest. The teacher to student ratio in the District is 11-1.
