"Please identify yourself"..Those are the words one hears if one attempts to enter the high school these days...The system works as follows: There is a buzzer with a camera at the front door when one attempts in to enter Lynbrook High...The "guard" located inside behind a glass partition will see you after you buzz on her screen at her desk...she will then ask you to "Please identify yourself and your purpose for entering"...if she recognizes you she then buzzes the door to open and you enter the foyer which is also locked after your enter...you are asked by the guard behind the glass partition sitting at the cafeteria entrance to "sign the guest book please"...if she does not recognize you she will have the student or the employee you are asking to see to come down to the front door to OK that person's entrance...If you are allowed to enter you are buzzed in to open the second door to allow you access to the high school building...if she has to call down a student, the student is given permission to pass into the foyer to visit with his/her parent/guardian to take care of the reason for the visit (dropping off a lunch, a book, athletic gear etc). Rarely is the parent buzzed into the main building but must meet the student in the enclosed locked foyer before departing the building. Times have changed. My concern is still what type of security will there be, if any is planned, to secure the gymnasium for entering spectators for basketball, wrestling, volleyball, badminton, concerts or Class Nite activities? BTW, all other doors to the building are locked with a teacher or a paid security guard located nearby to prevent anyone from entering through those doors. Students are encouraged not to exit through those doors and to never allow anyone to enter even if it is another student or employee. Cameras are located near every door and television screens for each area are located in a room near the principal's office for viewing or for reviewing at a later date. They are on 24-7.

"All Aboard!"...The LIRR has finally gotten around to upgrading the Lynbrook railroad station..there will be \$17.9 million allocated for repairs starting in the Spring of 2019. These repairs are to include complete platform rebuilding, improved waiting areas on the platforms, upgrading the downstairs ticket

office waiting room area, hopefully adding more escalators for each platform (A and B) and improving the supports that are holding up the LIRR trestle that is above Broadway near the White Castle. How long this will take or when it even gets started is always a big question when dealing with the LIRR.

When completed the LIRR has stated that this will be one of the "best stations" on the system. That's great as long as the train arrives on time.

On another side issue, it may be time for everyone to go back in time and to recall some of your favorite childhood toys.

Why you may ask? Well the National Toy Hall of Fame has announced this years finalists for selection for the honor of entering the Toy Hall of Fame.
