HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS..Yup, that's the theme. Each class then selected a comic/cartoon/movie character to write a script for their skit. The seniors selected The Muppet's, juniors Little Mermaid, sophomores The Wizard of Oz and the freshmen Shrek. Classnite is not as aggressively competitive as it was back when we were at LHS. The sports activities, no longer Sports Night, are held the last week in February. On Tuesday February 26 will be volleyball competition, Wednesday the 27th will be co-ed badminton and Thursday the 28th is Ultimate Frisbee (don't ask me what that is all about as I do not know) The skits are performed on the basketball court on Friday, March 15th.
